OWLS SHOW STEADY IMPROVEMENT LOOKING FORWARD TO TOURNAMENT

After losing Senior Matt Vraney for the season when he reinjured his knee during the first week of practice, it took the 2009 – 2010 Slinger Owls basketball team a while to hit its stride. Vraney was the only returning starter from the prior year, and would likely have led the team in scoring and rebounding this year. In his absence, the Owls struggled at times early in the season to score. However, as of late, the team has been hitting its stride with improved scoring punch led by improved three-point shooting.

Slinger opened the season at home by winning the championship of the “Old Scenic Moraine” Thanksgiving Tournament on Friday, November 27th, and Saturday, November 28th. The Owls beat Grafton 46 – 34 in a first round game, and then defeated Mayville 52 – 37 in the championship game on Saturday night. Sophomore guard Kirk Emmer led the team in scoring both nights with 17 points against Grafton, and 15 points against Mayville. In the Grafton game, Senior guard Jordan Teschendorf and Sophomore forward Dan Sabin each chipped in nine points. In the Mayville game, Senior guard Brennan Quinn added 11 points.

The Owls picked up a hard fought 47 – 40 nonconference win over Lomira before opening conference play at Watertown. The Owls’ scoring woes put them in a hole early as they trailed 25 – 8 at halftime, and never recovered in the 48 – 27 loss.

The team started out 5 – 2 before hitting the skids with a five game losing streak. Inexperience was evident during the first half of the season as the Owls struggled to play “complete” games. The third quarter of a lot of the games was the turning point for the Owls, as they often would enter halftime with a lead or small deficit, only to dig themselves a hole in the third quarter that they could not recover from. As the season has moved along, and the key players have gained more experience and confidence, this has not been a problem.

The Owls snapped their five game losing streak in exciting fashion with a buzzer beating victory at home over Oconomowoc. Cooney was picked to finish as high as second in the Wisconsin Little Ten Conference this season, but has suffered some close losses. The game was close throughout with neither team leading by more than six points. Senior guard Jordan Teschendorf kept the Owls close in the second half by hitting three three-point baskets. Senior guard Kevin Burns hit a runner with 25 seconds to go to give the Owls a 51 – 50 lead. However, Oconomowoc scored on a put back basket and foul with 7 seconds left to take the lead back. After a missed Cooney free throw, Slinger pushed the ball up court, but was fouled twice – as they were not yet in the bonus. The Owls had a side out of bounds with 2.1 seconds left. With Teschendorf coming off of a double screen, three Cooney defenders jumped out to defend him. This allowed Brennan Quinn to “slip” down the lane to receive the inbound pass and make a wide open layup just before the buzzer to give Slinger a thrilling 53 – 52 victory.

After a 64 – 61 road win at Hartford, the Owls almost pulled out another exciting home win against the second place 13 – 2 Watertown squad. Slinger rallied from a five point deficit with 15 second left in regulation to send the game into overtime on a three-point basket by Brennan Quinn and, then after two missed Gosling free throws, Kirk Emmer hit a 14-foot jumper at the buzzer. However, in overtime, a 12-foot shot by Emmer with two seconds left bounced off the rim as they suffered a tough 53 – 52 loss.

The team has had balanced scoring from its starting guards. After a slow start to the season, Teschendorf has hit 21 three-point baskets in the last eight games. Emmer has scored in double figures in 14 of 20 games, while Teschendorf has hit the double figure mark in 11 games and Quinn in 10 of the 20 games so far this season.

In WIAA tournament play this year, Slinger will play as a Division 1 team for the third time in four years. Slinger is the smallest Division 1 high school this year based upon enrollment figures. The Owls will be part of the Oshkosh Sectional including fellow Wisconsin Little Ten Conference teams Beaver Dam, West Bend East, West Bend West, and Hartford. The Owls, with their then 10 – 10 overall record, were awarded the #8 seeding out of 14 teams in the Sectional, and will open up the tournament on Tuesday night, March 2nd, at 7:00

pm in Slinger hosting the #9 seeded Stevens Point Panthers (8-13). The other teams and their seeds are #1 Oshkosh North (who advanced to the Division 1 State Championship Semifinals last year), #2 Beaver Dam, #3 Neenah, #4 Sheboygan South, #5 Sheboygan North, #6 Wisconsin Rapids, #7 Fond du Lac, #10 Oshkosh West, #11 Hortonville, #12 Hartford, #13 West Bend West, and #14 West Bend East.
